Sailing Section:

The new sailing season has started and sailors from all the different classes have embraced the sailing with enthusiasm. During the past months members from the Mossel Bay yachting section attended several regattas both locally and at different venues in the Western and Eastern Cape. Notably was the clubs participation in the Bart's Bash event which was run on the 20th September.

Bart's Bash is a worldwide sailing event that aims to transform the lives of young people and is supported by clubs around the world. The event is run in honour Andrew "Bart" Simpson who tragically lost his life in an accident on board the yacht Artemis in San Francisco Bay in 2013. The race in Mossel Bay attracted 91 local sailors which was a record entry for any similar event at the club. Light conditions often made it difficult to maintain boat speed and the times recorded were not comparable with those achieved at clubs where the wind was more favourable.

The yachting section supported the Mossel Bay Sports Festival by running a regatta on the 3rd October. In total two fleets of single handed dinghies, one fleet of double handed dinghies and one fleet of catamarans participated. The Municipality recognised the participation of the sailors and presented medals to the winners from each fleet.

On the 24th -25th October George Lakes Yacht club ran an inter-club regatta which was attended by sailors from Mossel Bay and Knysna. The Mossel Bay contingent included 15 development sailors for which most this would be their first formal regatta. The fleet included Tera, Optimist, Dabchick, QBa, Topaz and Pico dinghies while the senior fleet consisted of 420's, 29érs, Bahia and Argo sailing boats. The exposure to regatta sailing proved to be valuable to all who attended and will serve the interests of especially the development sailors in future sailing events.

The Sailing School also was visited by Minister of Culture Affairs and Sport, Mrs Anroux Marais on the 16th November. During the visit she showed a keen interest the development work taking place at the Club and the young sailors had an opportunity to show off their skills on different dinghies. The Minister

was offered a sail on a Bahia and experienced firsthand the thrills and challenges of the sport.

The interest in keelboats has shown resurgence and an increasing number of boats are participating in the Sunday series which includes races around the Island or long haul event that sail around the Rig and the Island. The arrival of new boats and skippers at the club has contributed to this revival and it is expected that the enthusiasm will contribute to the continued growth in this section.

The club runs a number of regattas during the season and these are categorised as the spring, summer or Holiday series. These events are open to all the sailors at the club and races are run on a handicap system with participant accumulating points for each event in which he/she participates. Then Spring series was completed in October while the Summer series will have its final race at the end of November. These results are available on the MBYBC website. The Holiday series will commence in December and it is anticipated that these races will attract many of the visitors who bring boats to our shores for the festive season.

There will be club racing on the 16 December and 26 December 2015 and several races are planned for the holiday season during December and January. Information about these fun races will be displayed on the notice board at the Club and interested sailors are encouraged to participate.

We would like to take the opportunity to wish our club members and visitors to our sunny shores, a safe festive season and our sailors “fair winds and following seas”.

South Cape Deep Sea Angling (SCDSAA) recently sent a team to compete in the annual Rumbly Bay Interprovincial Tuna competition hosted by the Cape Ski Boat Club. The format of the competition is interesting because two competitions run concurrently, i.e., an interprovincial competition and a club competition. The distinction between the two competitions is that the provincial teams are only allowed to fish with 10kg breaking strain line while the club anglers may use up to 15kg. 42 anglers and 17 teams participated in the event. The three anglers who represented the SWD region were Marius Opperman, Jacko Meyer and Ewald Crause (captain).

After 2 days of fishing and two weather days (i.e., competition called off due to poor weather conditions) the team from SWD placed first for the interprovincial competition and won gold. A total of 25 long fin tuna were landed by the team who edged out second placed Western Province by 125 points. This equated to a single fish making the difference.

The team would like to thank SCDSAA for their support and for keeping deep sea angling an active sporting code in the region.

Finally we wish Ian Hamilton a speedy recovery after his knee replacement. Hope to see you in the water soon.





Rasta, Ricky 7 Abu on the 3 December; during last training session for the year at Santos. The water is great 21 degrees and the visibility has also improved.


